CODE OF CONDUCT FOR YEAR 11 PUPILS

Practical jokes will not be tolerated.

Eggs, flour and water pistols are strictly prohibited. There are three reasons for this.

- It is unfair to burden caretaking staff with unnecessary cleaning
- It is unacceptable to disrupt the education of the rest of the school
- It may lead to acts of criminal damage

Practical jokes with cars, buildings or other property, either on site or nearby, are unacceptable, and any damage done may be reported to the police as criminal damage.

Anyone who disregards these rules, or behaves in an inappropriate manner, is liable to incur action from the school. This may include the withdrawal of study leave. For those wishing to return in the sixth form, penalties may range from sanctions to be imposed when in the sixth form, to losing your sixth form place. For those intending to leave after Year 11, the school's action may be the withdrawal of all future support from the school, including support for GCSE re-marks, and refusal to support any future applications for higher education or jobs. Employers and future schools may also be contacted.

In more serious cases, in addition to bringing in the police, students may be excluded. This may lead to an inability to sit a GCSE examination.

This code of conduct applies not only on the last days before study leave, but even after your last examination. The school's policy is very clear:

Enjoy yourselves, celebrate, but do so in a civilised manner.
